The 2021 Global Seismological Observation Training Course Closed

The 2021 Global Seismology Observation course which started on January 14th, 2022 was closed on Friday, March 6th, 2022. At the online graduation ceremony held by JICA Tsukuba, all the 10 participants from Bhutan, Egypt, India, Iran, Kenya, Nepal, Philippines, Uganda received the certificates from Mr. Watanabe, Director general of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) Tsukuba and Dr. Midorikawa, the president of Building Research Institute (BRI). Mr. Mulwa from Kenya representing the participants expressed gratitude to them with his speech.

Although the training period was about two months, the participants were able to acquire the knowledge of the role of seismology in the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty Organization (CTBTO) regime and the International Monitoring System (IMS). They also studied global seismological observation technologies for monitoring nuclear tests and earthquakes, and acquired data analytical techniques to differentiate nuclear tests from natural earthquakes, which we believe are useful in analyzing natural earthquakes in their own countries.

We hope that the participants will share with many people in their home countries, what they've learned in Japan. We wish them the best of success in the future.



16 of IISEE course participants visited the Geospatial Information Authority of Japan (GSI) on the morning of March 11th, while the rest of the three took an online tour remotely from their home countries. First, they



took a lecture on observation and surveying technology, such as Interferometric SAR (Synthetic Aperture Radar). Then, GSI gave them a tour to the main building with a seismic-isolation system installed in 2010, explained about the outline of the main building and showed them the seismic isolated layer as well. Lastly, the participants visited the Science Museum of Map and Survey to learn about the history, principles and new technologies of map and surveying technologies, where they showed great interest and asked questions enthusiastically.
